with the eighth release for the [Literature in Flux](#) project, I would like to inform you about the next part of the Danube Festival [Literature in Flux](#) in Cetate (Romania) – between 29 September and 2 October 2011. This part of the project is organized in cooperation with Port Cultural Cetate (Culture Port Cetate).

As part of a symposium entitled "Cultures of Remembrance" a selection of archive films from this year's Film and Culinary Art Lovers Festival (Festivalul degustatorilor de film si arta culinara) will be shown. The following day, there will be a panel discussion to broaden the topic on "Deconstructing European and Danubian mythologies" based on an article written by the Romanian historian Anca Costa-Foru on the economic and civilizing importance of the Danube. The existing myths will not only be deconstructed, but also pushed forward, redefined and rediscovered. The Romanian events also offer room for fantasy and imagination: in addition to the reading with Filip Florian (Romania), Nataša Kramberger (Slovenia), Vladan Matijević (Serbia) and Linda Stift (Austria), visitors can experience the artistic performance "Launch of Noah's Ark" by Daniel Balanescu and Maxim Corciova or discover regional history with Mircea Dinescu and Dinu Adam. Our last day in Romania – the 2 October – will end with a surprise concert.
